Seven weeks after Passover, in the early summer, comes the festival of Shavuot. We celebrate the giving of the Torah to Moses and the Jewish People at Mount Sinai, as well as the arrival of the first fruits of the new harvest. As the new grain and new produce nourish and sustain our bodies, so God's word nourishes and sustains our spirits.



Upon receiving the Torah, we read that the Land of Israel was "flowing with milk and honey" (Exodus 3:18). Dairy products have become associated with this holiday and many people eat ice cream, cheesecake or cheese blintzes to celebrate Shavuot.

The year is winding up. Between Preschool graduation, the final day of Religious School and having laid to rest Confirmation and the Baccalaureate Service for High School Seniors, things have been hopping around here.

First, a big thank you to the Board for continuing to support the Preschool. Our Preschool is such an important gateway for young families to become connected to synagogue life. The Preschool Parents Association has been especially active and supportive of the Kehillah this year, spending over \$1200.00 to refurbish the playground mulch, making it a safe place for all of our children. The Preschool Parents Association has also hosted, for the entire Kehillah, the Chanukah Palooza, which could be a twin to the Purim Carnival in terms of fun for our younger families!!!!

Thanks also to the Board of Trustees, the Religious School Committee, and, in particular, Chair Rich Newman, for their support of our Religious School Programs for kindergarten through 10th grade (and actually, this year, due to our participation in a city wide program, programming through 12th grade was offered). Here are a few of the things accomplished this year:

The Religious School Committee began an effort to introduce a new program in our 6th/7th grade classes called *Tzedakah in Action*. This program encourages families to donate to a common fund in lieu of monetary Bar/Bat Mitzvah gifts to individual students. In the 7th grade year, the students act as a foundation and research various charities and decide as a group how the money is distributed. One goal is to create more responsible and compassionate young people. This program will NOT replace the individual mitzvah project, but is intended to encourage students to remain with the Religious School program after their Bar/Bat Mitzvah.

Our 6th grade class, under the leadership of Caroline Figiel, spearheaded a Bake Sale, complete with Public Service Announcements and the creation of logos which resulted in over \$400.00 donated to the North Fulton Community Charities, and \$100.00 donated to the Education Fund here at TKC (part of that was a donation in honor of the students' efforts!)

Please take the time to stroll through our upstairs hallway and look up. Over the past four years our 9th graders have been expressing themselves creatively and Judaically on our ceiling tiles – it's not just a white hallway anymore!!!! We've also added a tree to the end of the hall. It has endless possibilities for use as a mitzvah tree, reminders to support the efforts of the Jewish National Fund - trees for Israel) and as just a beautiful work of art. One of our Preschool parents, Amy Cohen-Huffine, who also has a daughter in our 2nd grade class in Religious School, graciously donated her time and talents to create this beautiful piece of art.

Our 10th graders, with Cantor Margulis leading the way, once again graced the halls of Congress in Washington DC, lobbying their senators and congressional representatives to consider the Reform Jewish point of view on many pressing issues of the day. This year was the seventh group we have sent to Washington, DC. We are already registered to send a group of 10th graders next March.

Klub 345 ended its inaugural year with 21 3rd, 4th and 5th graders attending one or more of the events. Suesan Phillips stepped forward to volunteer to take the lead, with support from Carey Grucza, Eric Simon, Rod Hasterok, and Sarah Grucza. We hope to parlay the success with the 5th graders making the transition to Junior Youth Group and beyond in years to come. Many thanks to Suesan for being willing to volunteer to make this a success!!!!

Please watch your email for registration information for Religious School for the fall. We are changing the way in which tuition is paid for school and for B'nai Mitzvah fees. In lieu of raising rates as we have for four of the past five years, we are asking for a non-refundable registration fee of \$50.00 per student, not to exceed \$100.00 per family. We will also begin this fall asking parents to begin paying B'nai Mitzvah fees when they receive the Bar/Bat Mitzvah date. More details will be sent to you shortly.

I hope we can continue to move forward as a caring, creative and curious (about all things Jewish) Kehillah family!!! I invite your suggestions and help in creating ever more challenging and interesting educational programming here at the Kehillah! Please contact Rich Newman, Religious School Committee Chair, or Steve Best, VP Education about volunteering for any of our Education or Youth Committees.

As always, we depend on you to support our Hebrew program outside of Religious School. The easiest way is to bring your child to services often during the summer. We have many fun Shabbat services planned for the summer and you sure can't complain about the way we invite everyone to dress – it's casual dress Shabbat during the summer.

I hope to see you regularly at services!!

I'm back!

After a year “off,” I have again succeeded to the presidency of Temple Kehillat Chaim. The fact that I am the first president to ever serve a second time is, I assure you, no reflection of my talents and abilities, but powerful evidence that TKC has developed a leadership predicament.

Before going any further, however, I must offer my thanks – and I know all of you join me – to my predecessor. Joyce Forgoston Bogrow worked incredibly hard and dealt with many challenges the past year, and she leaves with her head held high. We all wish her the best.

As I noted above, our reserve of congregants who feel prepared and driven to occupy positions of secular leadership – officers, trustees, and committee chairs – has become rather thin, as if a baseball team’s bullpen was running out of relief pitchers. Over time, we have gradually evolved a culture in which service to the synagogue is seen as being somewhere between a nuisance and a burden. This cannot continue. We must encourage and nurture an attitude in which congregant service is viewed the way it should be – as a time-manageable honor.

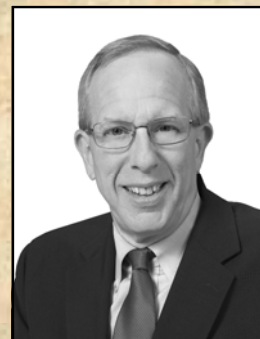
It didn’t happen overnight and it won’t be resolved overnight, but I’m encouraged that we are finally responding. Rabbi Winokur, past president Mark Silberman, and treasurer Shelley Miller are developing programming designed to identify and prepare congregants who are interested in leadership. Our past presidents have a plan for mentoring new Board members.

Speaking of new Board members, we have just elected the largest group I can remember – eight new officers and trustees have begun their duties. Please join me in welcoming them: Renee Sevy Hasterok, who occupies the new position of executive vice president / president-elect, and with whom I will be working closely in eventual transition; Matt Edelstein, Michelle Erste, and Mike Sobel (at-large trustees to 2012); and Peggy Callendar, Kitty Glickman, David Lutchen, and Eric Smolin (at-large trustees to 2013). As mentioned above, Shelley Miller returns, on a temporary basis. Joyce remains as immediate past president. Steve Best, Kathy Starr, and Hiedi Weiss are back as vice presidents, Rhonda Flynn as secretary, and Pete Suresky as at-large trustee to 2012. I look forward to working with this Board, as well as all of our volunteers, clergy, and staff. We know much is expected of us.

Like most other small synagogues, TKC faces various challenges, both short- and long-term. Leadership development is only one. Our membership numbers have been slipping, and prospective new members are scarce, which naturally affects finances. Revenues are not matching expenses, even though we have already cut spending in virtually every way imaginable. This underscores the importance of improved fundraising. Above all else, we must ascertain and provide the types of services and programming that are needed to reenergize our congregation; once more people want to come to our services, and prospective members can see a diverse and animated group of worshippers, we will have turned the tide and realized the spirit and attitude necessary to ensure our temple’s continued viability.

So let’s get started. Thank you for joining us.
